Geophysical Survey

Have you seen “**Time Team**” on the Television when they carry out a geophysical survey?

You know, they walk over a site with a frame and can produce images of density change in the ground beneath. From those images it is possible to deduce the location of ancient structures.

Well a geophysical survey is being carried out on Gannock Castle in Tempsford. This is an 11th Century Scheduled Ancient Monument surrounded by a moat, currently undergoing restoration with the aid of the LHI, a partnership between Heritage Lottery Fund, Nationwide Building Society and the Countryside Agency.
